Bexley is a suburb of approximately 13,000 residents located about four miles east of downtown Columbus, Ohio. Many residents are professional and business persons employed in Columbus.

Our School

Bexley High School is a four-year public high school accredited by the state of Ohio and the nationally recognized AdvancED organization.

Our Mission

To provide educational experiences that engage, equip and empower each student.

Marking System, GPA and Class Rank

Bexley High School groups core courses by achievement level, all of which provide for a college preparatory program. Core courses have NCAA Clearinghouse approval, with the lowest passing grade a “D-” and the college recommending grade a “C.” Grade Point Averages are calculated on a 4.0 basis, with only BHS courses computed in a student’s GPA. Transfer students will not have a GPA until one semester of work at BHS has been completed. Due to the highly competitive nature of Bexley High School, students are not ranked for college admission.

In the class of 2019, 68 were designated Summa Cum Laude, 84 received the Honors Diploma, and 40 graduated as members of the Cum Laude Society

Advanced Placement and Honors

All students enrolled in AP courses are required to take the AP exam, which is paid for by the school district; there is no limit on the number of AP courses a student may take.

Honors Courses: English 9 and 10, Advanced Algebra, Pre-calculus, Physical Science, Biology, Chemistry, French, Spanish and Latin

24 Advanced Placement Courses: Language and Composition, Literature and Composition, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Statistics, Biology, Chemistry, Physics I, Physics II, Environmental Science, American History, European History, World History, Psychology, U.S. Government and Politics, Economics, Computer Science Principles, Computer Science A, Spanish, French, Latin, Art History, Studio Art and Music Theory.

Special Programs

A Learning Center provides services for students with identified learning disabilities. Students may participate in alternative learning experiences at Eastland/Fairfield Career Center, Ohio’s College Credit Plus program, educational options (such as independent study, internships, distance learning, tutoring, and other experiences) and MOSAIC, an inter-disciplinary integrated curriculum with a global/multicultural focus.

College Admissions Testing

- Nine members of the class of 2020 were invited to participate in the National Merit Program’s College Plans Reporting Service.
- 68 students took the SAT in 2018-19 with the following mean scores.
 - Critical Reading: 630
 - Math: 645
- 155 members of the class of 2018 took the ACT with an average composite score of 25.9. 61% of students met the College Readiness Benchmark in all four subject areas.

College Statistics

Over the past 20 years, more than 90 percent of Bexley students have entered college after graduation. The class of 2019 had a college matriculation rate of 96 percent.

Highlights

- BHS was ranked the top school in Central Ohio (4th in Ohio, 132nd nationwide) by U.S. News and World Report
- Bexley High School earned an overall A rating on its annual report card, which included A ratings in the areas of Graduation Rate and Gap Closing
- In 2019, 463 students took a total of 1105 AP Exams with 78 percent earning a score of 3 or above.
