

Summer Work -- English Department

English 9: Students taking English 9 are encouraged to read a book over the summer (or more than one). The English 9 course focuses on developing strong readers; therefore, in preparation for the school year, we recommend that students find something they like to read and practice over the summer.

Honors English 9: Students taking Honors English 9 are required to read one book from the memoir genre over the summer. The Honors English 9 course focuses on developing strong readers; therefore, in preparation for the school year, we recommend that students find something they like to read and practice by reading multiple books over the summer.

English 10: Students taking English 10 are encouraged to read a book over the summer (or more than one). The English 10 course focuses on developing strong readers; therefore, in preparation for the school year, we recommend that students find something they like to read and practice over the summer.

Honors English 10: Students taking Honors English 10 are required to read one book written by an author from outside the United States. It may be fiction or nonfiction. The Honors English 10 course focuses on developing strong readers; therefore, in preparation for the school year, we recommend that students find something they like to read and practice by reading multiple books over the summer.

English 11: Students taking English 11 next year should make it a priority to find a book to read prior to the start of the school year. Each student should make a selection with the following in mind:

- Is it a genre I enjoy?
- Is the language and text accessible to my level of reading?
- Can I complete the chosen text before the start of classes?

Students may read Fiction, Non-Fiction, Graphic Novel, Biographies, Anthologies, Collections, News pieces, Dramas or anything other text that lends itself to enjoyment and learning.
