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#### Facts:

★ District/School Emergency Operations Plan (EOP) are approved by the Ohio Department of Education/Homeland Security. They are not Public Records.



Facts (Cont):

- We Can't Script Every Crises
- Police Here in Two-Minutes or Less

Average School Threat Situation Lasts approximately 12 Minutes.



#### HISTORY 2001-2017

- 1. Drilled: Fire, Tornado, Modified Lock-Down, Lock-Down, & Stay Put.
- Installed Quick Locks on Classroom Doors
- 3. Installed Visitor Management System
  - Doors locked during school day (except for lunch) and weekends. Unlocked after school.



HISTORY
2017-2018 (Post Parkland)

 BHS/BMS students surveyed. Students felt safe during the school day but not so after school.



#### HISTORY 2018-2019

- Dr. Miller and BoE approves new Director of Operations position.
- Piloted Keypad Entry System for staff and students
- Worked with Safety and Security Experts to audit each campus.



Safety and Security Audit Results
Identified our five greatest assets to be:

- 1. Door locking systems
- 2. Mesh Windows and Film installed
  - 3. Frequent Drills and AAR (debrief)
- 4. Culture
  - 5. Close proximity to Bexley PD

Communication and Alerts

Staff Goals (Applies to all Crises):

- 1. Protect Students
- 2. Don't Make Matters Worse

#### Bexley City Schools Crisis Response Levels

Lockdown

Is there a threat inside the building?

Lock Out - Gather people into a room. Lock and barricade door.

Get Out - If able to avoid the threat, leave building and go to rally point.

Take Out - As a last resort, you may attack the threat if you choose.

Have your phone on silent, messages will be sent when threat is over.

Never unlock door - we have a key.
When prompted, slide a red card under your door
if someone is injured and a green card if not.

Reverse Evacuation Is there a law enforcement event happening outside?

Move staff and students inside the building.

Send message to parents explaining the emergency and advise no one may enter or exit the building until ALL CLEAR.

Shelter In Place Is there a weather hazard outside?

Move staff and students inside the building. If tornado related, move to tornado safe area.

Stay Put Is there a crisis requring halls to be clear?

Students and staff remain in room until incident is over.
