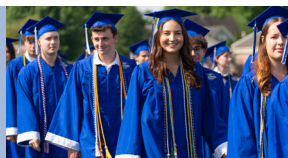

OUR COMMUNITY

Bexley is a suburb of about 13,000 residents located about four miles east of downtown Columbus, Ohio. Many residents are professional and business persons employed in the Columbus area.

OUR SCHOOL

Bexley High School is a four-year public high school accredited by the State of Ohio and the nationally recognized AdvancED organization (now Cognia).

MARKING SYSTEM, GPA & CLASS RANK

Bexley High School groups core classes by achievement level, all of which provide a college preparatory program. Core courses have NCAA-Clearinghouse approval, with the lowest passing grade of "D-" and a college recommendation grade of "C." Grade-point averages are calculated on a 4.0 scale, with only BHS courses computed into a student's GPA. Transfer students do not have a GPA until one semester of course work is completed at Bexley High School. Due to the highly competitive nature of Bexley High School, students are not ranked for college admissions.

CLASS OF 2024 HONORS

A total of 98 students in the Class of 2024 were designated Summa Cum Laude, while 67 received the Honors diploma, and 42 graduated as members of the Cum Laude Society.

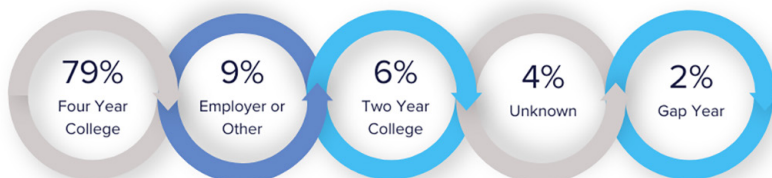

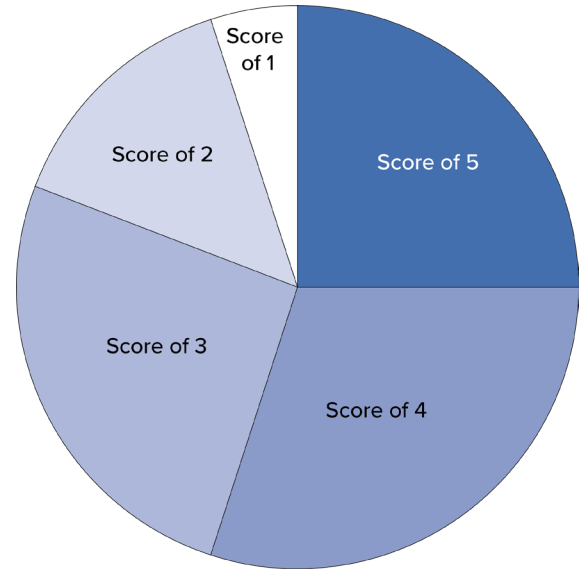


ACADEMIC HIGHLIGHTS

- 9 members of the class of 2024 were named semifinalists for the National Merit Scholarship Competition
- *In 2023-2024, 49 students earned SAT average scores of 1258, and 172 students earned ACT test scores with a 24.79 composite average.
- Bexley High School was named to Collegeboard's 2024 AP Platinum Honor Roll.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAM RESULTS

In 2024, 422 students completed 934 AP exams, with 81% earning a score of 3 or higher.



ADVANCED PLACEMENT & HONORS CLASSES

All students enrolled in AP courses are required to take the AP exam, which is paid for by the school district. There is no limit on the number of AP courses a student may take.

27 ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES:

Art History, Biology, Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Chemistry, Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles, Economics (Macro and Micro), Environmental Science,

European History, French, Language & Composition, Latin, Literature & Composition, Music Theory, Physics I, Physics II, Psychology, Spanish, Statistics, Art and Design (2D, 3D & Drawing), U.S. Government & Politics, U.S. History, and World History.

11 HONORS COURSES:

Algebra I, Biology, Chemistry, English 9, English 10, French IV, Geometry, Latin III, Precalculus, Spanish IV, and World Studies.

CAPITAL UNIVERSITY DUAL CREDIT PROGRAM

Students who complete Multivariable Calculus are eligible to earn up to 8 college credit hours through our Capital University Dual Credit Program partnership. Multivariable

Calculus is designed for students who have taken the AP Calculus BC course and are interested in higher-level math. The curriculum is equivalent to college courses in Calculus II and Calculus III.
